

FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK

Dear Friend of Christians in Action,

As a passionate Christ follower, your heart naturally calls out for godly change in the world. You want to make a difference for the Kingdom of God—to do something that advances the Great Commission. *My heart is the same as yours.*

Christians in Action sends out missionaries and asks them to work under challenging circumstances. As they learn a brand-new language, they experience unrelenting culture shock. *We* send them off, and *they* are expected to build remarkable ministries for the glory of the Lord. All praise to Almighty God; He uses them to build His kingdom.

**However, at this very moment CinA Missionaries have 33 unfunded or underfunded projects that are key to growing their ministries. The total project shortfall amounts to \$428,000 spread throughout many of the 20 countries in which we share the love of Christ.**

*I have a momentous idea. Let's endow them to do even more.*

Let me tell you about three exciting projects which will greatly enhance our witness to the physically and spiritually poor in West Africa. These projects involve Christians in Action leaders Issa and Daphne Kargbo laboring in Sierra Leone, Christian and Augusta Kallon in Liberia, and Julius and Beatrice Nangai in Ghana, West Africa. At this time of year, as we celebrate our children's graduations, so their hearts are impassioned to bring quality education to the next generation in West Africa as here at home. Lacking proper education and vocational training, these young people will struggle to overcome the suffocating cycle of poverty.

These leaders' ardent prayer is to enhance their educational capability. In Liberia, they need additional classrooms, in Sierra Leone resources to train signers for the deaf, and in Ghana procurement of school computers and classroom remodeled to help unleash the power the poor and deaf lack without adequate support for education and training. The ultimate vision in Liberia is to accommodate education through sixth grade; in Sierra Leone to train 150 faithful persons to provide technical and vocational education training for 120 deaf, and plant three churches with high concentrations of deaf persons; in Ghana to procure computers and remodel a classroom to accommodate and inspire 250 students, and in this way, in all three West African missions, introduce the students' parents and families to Jesus. **Education is key to unlocking the trap of poverty, and opening a doorway to the Gospel.**

These are just three stories of projects needing funding to facilitate reaching the unreached among those wherein Christians in Action is championing Christ across the globe. Please partner with us as we work to carry out the Great Commission to "... make disciples of all nations..." (Matthew 28:19a).

I invite you to come alongside us in prayer and with generous giving to make these, and other projects, realities. We are also seeking support for worthy projects of business development, leadership and discipleship training, as well as medical and dental missions, and many other efforts in Central and South America, Mexico and the Caribbean, Central, South and East Asia. As you invest in the Great Commission, you're making way for Gospel Discipleship to thrive in hard-to-reach areas of the world.

***We are harvesting souls on mission fields at this very moment! Can I count on you to help finance this harvest?***

May there come an abundant harvest from your generosity. As the Apostle Paul reminded the church at Corinth: "...Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously" (2 Corinthians 9:6b).
